I. Call to Order and Roll Call

Chair Friedman called the January 23, 2025 Central Coast Water Authority (CCWA) Board of Directors meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

A. Report on Closed Session Actions (if any)

Mr. Ray Stokes, CCWA Executive Director, reported that during closed session the Board directed staff to begin planning the search process for the Executive Director position.

IV. Public Comment

There was no public comment related to items not on the agenda.

V. Consent Calendar

Upon a motion by Director Coates, seconded by Director Springer and carried with Directors, Balch, Clay, Coates, Friedman, Sanchez, Springer, and Werner in favor and none opposed the Board approved the Consent Calendar.

VI. Executive Director's Report

A. Water Supply Situation Report

Mr. David Beard, CCWA Deputy Director of Operations and Engineering, provided the Water Supply Situation Report presentation which reviewed the expected precipitation for the upcoming water year as well as rainfall within State Water Project watersheds, and storage levels within San Luis Reservoir. He also provided an update related to the amount of carryover water allowed in the reservoir as well as pending water transfer agreements.

B. California Aqueduct Subsidence Update

Mr. Beard provided a slideshow created by the California Aqueduct Subsidence Program (CASP) and provided to State Water Contractors earlier this month. The topic of subsidence has been under discussion since the creation of the state water project but has increased in priority in the recent years. CASP reports reductions in the system's capacity to move water due to subsidence are as high as 46% and the current reductions in conveyance capacity will increase as subsidence continues. Re-establishing system capacities lost to subsidence may require billions of dollars over the next 20 years. Mr. Beard reviewed various scenarios and models related to the subsidence issue as well as interim actions being considered.

Mr. Stokes noted that the issue could potentially create a large budgetary impact on CCWA and its participants.

C. State Water Project Facility Golden Mussel Detection

In October 2024 Golden Mussels were first detected in North America in Stockton, and since then have been detected in State Water Project Facilities. Mr. Beard reviewed the potential impacts of the highly invasive species and potential spread due to their ability to tolerate various water conditions. Response actions being taken by multiple agencies, including State Water Contractors, California Fish and Wildlife were reviewed.

D. Solstra California Communities LLC's Solomon Hills Project

Mr. Stokes provided background information on Solstra California Communities LLC (Solstra)'s proposed housing development within CCWA's service area and that Solstra may require use of the Coastal Branch and/or CCWA's facilities to serve its project. Mr. Stokes also described that CCWA Counsel, Brownstein Hyatt Farber Schreck, LLP, also represents Solstra with respect to the proposed

development and has requested a waiver of potential conflicts of interests between CCWA and Solstra. Solstra would be represented by separate counsel, Mr. Peter Candy, of the Hollister & Brace firm, with respect to all transactions with CCWA.

Staff requested Board of Directors approval of: (1) Brownstein's proposed waiver of conflict of interest letter relating to Brownstein's concurrent representation of Solstra, (2) a cost reimbursement agreement between CCWA and Solstra related to any CCWA costs incurred in responding to Solstra's proposed project; (3) a finding that the Board's approval of the proposed cost reimbursement agreement is exempt from California Environmental Quality Act; and (4) direction with respect to any policies that may be required respond to Solstra's use of CCWA facilities.

The Board discussed the recommendations and expressed concerns relating to the waiver of conflict of interest, both in the language within the waiver and the representation by Solstra, as well as entities that may have an interest in the Solstra project, including Golden State Water Company, a CCWA project participant. Solstra's counsel, Peter Candy, was present and noted that he would be representing Solstra in any matter that involved CCWA. Ms. Hastings stated that if the Board approved the requested conflict of interest waiver, Brownstein would continue to represent CCWA in all transactions involving Solstra. Alternatively, she explained that the Board may wish to retain separate counsel with respect to the Solstra project.

Following discussion, the Board requested the Executive Director defer the matter and contact CCWA's conflict counsel, Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth LLP, for legal advice with respect to the requested conflict of interest waiver. The Board also requested changes to the proposed cost reimbursement agreement to provide further clarification of the nature and scope of the services that CCWA staff would be providing related to the Solstra project.

On a motion by Director Coates, seconded by Director Balch and carried with Directors Balch, Coates, Friedman, Sanchez, Springer and Werner in favor and none opposed the Board continued action item 1, the Waiver of Conflict of Interest to a future Board meeting.

On a motion by Director Sanchez, seconded by Director Werner and carried with Directors Balch, Coates, Friedman, Sanchez, Springer, and Werner in favor and none opposed the Board continued action items 2 through 4, the Cost Reimbursement Agreement, CEQA Exemption and Executive Director Authorization to draft policies related to the use of CCWA facilities to a future Board meeting.

E. FY 2024/25 Second Quarter Investment Report

Ms. Dessi Mladenova, CCWA Controller, reported as of December 31, 2024, the investment portfolio totaled \$61.8 million and had an effective rate of return of 4.13% on an average daily balance for the month of December 2024 of about \$57 million. The investments were comprised of Montecito Bank & Trust money market accounts (\$1.4 million) and Charles Schwab market funds of \$60.4 million.

All investments during the quarter complied with the CCWA investment policy provisions and current pro forma projections indicate that the Authority will have sufficient cash with which to operate for the next six months.

Upon a motion by Director Sanchez, seconded by Director Springer and carried with Directors Balch, Coates, Friedman, Sanchez, Springer, and Werner in favor and none opposed the Board accepted the second quarter FY 2024/25 investment report.

F. FY Ended June 30, 2024 and 2023 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report

The CCWA Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) for FY Ended June 30, 2024 and 2023 was included in the meeting materials, and Ms. Mladenova stated Glenn Burdette, the audit firm responsible for review of the ACFR, had provided a clean opinion. The Government Finance Officers Association had awarded CCWA the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the prior year's report.

The Board thanked Ms. Mladenova and staff for their work on the report.

Upon a motion by Director Springer, seconded by Director Coates and carried with Directors Balch, Coates, Friedman, Sanchez, Springer, and Werner in favor and none opposed the Board accepted the FY Ended June 30, 2024 and 2023 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report.

G. FY 2025/26 Budget Preparation Schedule

CCWA prepares its budget annually on a Fiscal Year basis, with the FY beginning July 1. Ms. Mladenova noted that DWR provides its Statement of Charges on a calendar year basis which presents challenges for budget estimates for the new calendar year. The budget preparation schedule was included in the meeting materials for the information of the Board.

H. State Water Contractors Report

State Water Contractors (SWC) are continuing work towards State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) approval of Healthy Rivers and Landscapes, which has been presented to the SWRCB, as well as other matters.

Note 3: DWR Reserve Fund

The DWR Reserve Fund was established to provide a funding source for payments to the State of California Department of Water Resources (DWR) when there is a difference between estimates used to prepare the DWR portion of the annual CCWA budget and the actual amounts billed to the Authority by DWR. Contributions to the DWR Reserve Fund are voluntary. Funding of each participating Project Participant's share of the DWR Reserve Fund will come from a combination of (1) CCWA Operating Expense budget surpluses, if any (2) Interest earnings on funds held in all other accounts on behalf of the participating Project Participant and (3) excess amounts, if any, from any of the DWR Statement of Charges cost components until the funding Target Amount is reached. The Target Amount will be equal to the participating Project Participant's proportional share of a \$10 million allocation of DWR Transportation Minimum OMP&R charges.
